LEVIEW AND LECOLIENDATIONS

I. TATAL DATA: The accused was tried at Dachau, Germany, 24 June 1947, before a General Lilitary Government Court.

II. CHARGE AND PARTICULARS:

CHARGE: Violation of the Laws and Usages of War.

Particulars: In that Ludwig Johann Michael ENGELHAD, a German national, did, at or near HOLBOULG, Bolgium, on or about 27 May 1944, wrongfully kill an unknown member of the United States army, who was then and there in the act of surrendering himself to the then German Reich.

III. DATA AS TO ACCUSED:

Ludwig Johann Michael ENGELHALD

This accused was acquitted (R 67).

IV. SURMAN OF EVIDENCE: On 25 May 1944 an American flior parachuted to safety in the vicinity of Hombourg, Bolgium (a. 6, 7, 16, 17; P-Exs 3, 4). The accused and wilhelm Schmitz get on a postoffice car and started towards the area where the flier had landed (a. 7, 34). The accused saw the flier land in the read, take off his parachute, place the parachute on the hodge nearby (a. 34) and climb ever the hodge (b. 35). When the accused and Schmitz arrived they could not see the flier so they yelled several times. The flier then steed up behind the hodge which was approximately chest high. The accused and Schmitz then excluded the flier to put up his hands, also indicating by notions what they meant. The flier did not obey this command but moved as though to pick up senething from the ground (a. 7, 35). The accused shot the flier and he died involiately (a. 7, 16, 17, 20, 36; 1-2xs 3, 4, 6). The flier did not offer to surrender (a. 11). The accused testified that the flier started to run away and that before firing at him he yelled for him to

halt but he continued to run (1. 35, 36). The Court had jurisdiction of the person of the accused and of the subject matter;

V. CONCLUSIONS:

It is recommended that the record of trial be filed in the records of this office and that a copy of this Novice and decommendations be forwarded to the Judge Advocate, European Command, for his information.
