Interpellation regarding the phrase "Hakko Ichiu"

We respectfully present the above according to the House regulations.

Interpellation on the phrase "Hakko Ichiu"

Prime Minister Prince KONOE, soon after his formation of the Cabinet, last July, in accordance with the Imperial Command, announced his basic national policies. At the outset he stated roughly as follows:-

"The guiding national policy of our country is to bring about world peace based on the spirit of our National Inauguration, namely of "making the world one home" (T.N. Translation of the Japanese phrase "HAKKO WO ICHIU TO SURU" according to the popular version). This means to say that "Hakko Ichiu" is our guiding national policy."

Again at the 2nd sub-Committee meeting of the Budget Committee of the House of Representatives held on January 31, 1941, Education Minister HASHIDA made his reply to the interpellation of MORITA, Jujiro about the meaning of the phrase "Hakko Ichiu". In it, he stated his version of the great spirit of our National Inauguration. It seems to us that it was really a very important utterance. We, thereupon, make the following two questions.

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1. What version does Prime Minister Konoze entertain of the phrase "Hakko Ichiu"?

2. Is the phrase "Hakko Ichiu" similar in meaning to the phrase "amenoshita o oite iye to semu"? (T.N. "I will make a house of the firmament.")

We respectfully enquire on the above points.

KOYAMA, Matsutoshi Esq., Speaker of the House of Representatives.

Sir: To the interpellation made by IKUTA Kazuhira and one other regarding the phrase "Hakko Ichiu", we present a written reply as herewith enclosed.

Reply to the interpellation of IKUTA Kazuhira and one other re the words "Hakko Ichiu".

1. The phrase "Hakko Ichiu" originated in the following passage which we find in the rescript of Emperor Jimmu on the occasion of the inauguration of his seat of government. "I will respond to the Virtue of the Sun Goddess High in Heaven who bestowed on us this Land and will propagate the Spirit of Her Grandson (T.N. NINIGINO-MIKOTO) who cultivated Righteousness. Then isn't it good to open up a capital on the basis of the entire land and build up a house or houses (T.N. nothing is mentioned which denotes that it must be considered singular) under heaven?"

This, it seems to me, is to respond to the Virtue of the Sun Goddess who bestowed on us all things and nourished them and leads them to propagate the Spirit of Her Grandson (T.N. NINIGINO-MIKOTO) who cherished Righteousness and, thus, by the Grandson of the Virtue of the

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Sun-Goddess to make the firmament a affinital body like one home.  
For this reason by the phrase "Hakko Ichiu", we understand the manifestation of the Imperial Will of enabling various nations including our own to secure their due places and develop their respective specific traits.

2. I consider the phrase "Hakko Ichiu" to be of the same meaning as the phrase "Hakko o oite Iye to sasu" (T.N. "To make a house of the firmament")

The above is our reply.
