Dear Mr. Ambassador,


I have not yet received a response to my letter of 7 January 2014, which I attach.

As my defence case is expected to come to a close in the next few weeks, I would greatly appreciate it if you could advise me as soon as possible whether Mr. Dusan Jankovic is required for any criminal proceedings in progress in the Court of Bosnia and Herzegovina during the period he is required by the Tribunal, which is expected to be between 10 and 15 February 2014, and whether the transfer of Mr. Jankovic will extend the period of detention beyond that foreseen by the Bosnian authorities.

This information is necessary for the Trial Chamber to order the transfer of Mr. Jankovic to The Hague. Further delay may result in me being unable to close my defence case at the time the Trial Chamber is expecting it to be concluded.

I would appreciate your prompt response to this request. Thank you for your cooperation.

Dear Mr. Ambassador,

Thank you for your letter of 27 December 2013 seeking clarification as to the identity of Dusan Jankovic, who I have indicated that I wish to call as a witness in my defence case.

Please be advised that Mr. Jankovic has a date of birth of 8 March 1950.

As I indicated earlier, he is serving a 21 year sentence imposed by the War Crimes Chamber of the Court of Bosnia and Herzegovina on 12 May 2012 in case number S1 1 K 003472. I am informed that he is serving that sentence in Foca Prison.


Given the time which has passed since my request of 12 November 2013, I have rescheduled Mr. Jankovic's testimony to 14 February 2014.

Can you kindly advise us whether the presence of Mr. Jankovic is required for any criminal proceedings in progress in the Court of Bosnia and Herzegovina during the period the witness is required by the Tribunal, which is expected to be between 10 and 15 February 2014, and whether the transfer of Mr. Jankovic will extend the period of detention beyond that foreseen by the Bosnian authorities? This information is required in order for the Trial Chamber to issue a decision for transfer of Mr. Jankovic to The Hague.

In addition, I am requesting that you allow my investigator Milomir Savcic to interview Mr. Jankovic at his place of confinement on Monday, 20 January 2014, so as to obtain a statement from Mr. Jankovic for use at my trial.

I would appreciate your prompt response to this request. Thank you for your cooperation.
