Sworn Deposition

Deponent: Rempei SASSA

I, Rempei SASSA, having first been duly sworn, do depose and say:

I have been duly licensed to practice medicine in Japan for the past 33 years specializing in internal medicine only. I am not a specialist in arterio-sclerosis or diseases of the brain. I knew Baron HARADA as a friend for many years but I never treated him professionally until March 15th, 1941.

I have practically all of my medical records of my treatment of patients since the earthquake of 1923. In reviewing my records I find the following appearing therein with respect to my treatment of Baron HARADA, Kumao. The following is found in my 145th volume:

INITIAL DIAGNOSIS OF MR. HARADA, Kumao

On 15th March 1941 From 3:05 P.M. - 6:12 P.M. At OISO-machi, Komadera-shita

About 2 or 3 years ago he experience being suddenly reduced to a condition incurring difficulty in speaking in front of the OISO Station.

Dr. Ryuko SASAKI came to examine him, as a result of which he was forbidden to take meat and to smoke.

Last summer he had a sudden attack of asthma. Dr. SONEDA gave him some injections which was able to ease his pain. The following day he rose up but would soon feel tired. The next attack came on 9 February when he was tidying up a store room at OKITSU, which, however, was eased after being given some injections.

On the 11th, he returned home. Temperature, then, was 38 degrees, with coughing and expectorating noticed. However he did not keep to bed. Recently he has become short of breath when ascending stairs.

8 March: He consulted Ir. KATSUNUMA of the NAGOYA UNIVERSITY.

Extreme enlargement of heart noticed.
Two pieces of X-ray photographs taken.
An examination was made of the electro-cardiogram.
Condition worse since last night. Pulse rapid,
shortness of breath felt with some coughing and
expectorating.

Condition. Fat, obesity; traces of cyanosis, visible; pulse up to 120, regular, alternating pulse; blood-pressure - 180 130; rapid breathing; apex heat; impalpable, about two finger's
breadth outward by percussion note.

Second aortic sound, accentuated; lung region: in the lower part on both sides, especially in the right part, rale, audible, moderate; liver, palpable, lower border of liver; impalpable; traces of oedema in lower limbs.

## Diagnosis:

Cardiac-weakness, as a result of high bloodpressure with fat-heart.

## Treatment:

Prognosis - good; continuous attention for a week or two necessary.

During 1941 I treated Baron HARADA on the following dates: Merch 15, 1941; March 27th, 1941; April 26th, 1941 and May 31st, 1941. The next time I saw him professionally was August 22, 1942. My clinical diary from the 152nd volume shows the following:

Saturday, 22 August, 1942 (1:40 P.M. - 5:20 P.M.) Mr. HARADA, Kumao Age 55 FINAL DIAGNOSIS - 31 May Lest year.

This time his condition changed for the worse on his way back to Tokyo from Karuizawa when passing somewhere around ANNAKA. Hereupon he went to SHIMBASHI accompanied by his wife (who had come to meet him at the UENO Station) where he was shown into the station-master's room, and sent for Mr. MURAYAMA. Then, he left for OISO with Mr. MURAYAMA. He was seen yawning in the train. Somewhere around at TSUJIDO, half the part of his body was seen in bad condition and his tongue rather thick. Got off at OISO at night (10.28 p.m.) Mr. ( ) was at the station to meet him. He was unable to speak but could walk quite well. He lay down for about ten minutes on returning home, owing to which his tongue condition improved and his words, though inarticulate, were more or less understandable.

A dose of O.I. (grams or c.c.) of Ruminahr (T.N.) was taken by him. Little sleep. This morning, speaking inarticulate. No fever. About five or six years ago, his left arm and leg became numb, but had recovered after a week or so.

Main Complaints:

Unable to speak. Something wrong with his right hand. Legs normal. Blood pressure as usual - 150 - 95.

Consciousness clear; countenance natural; tongue extremely to the right, unable to speck; pupil nothing peculiar; pulse 80, regular; tension of
pulse, rather strong; apex heat, two fingers' breadth
outward from the 6th intercostal space and mamillary
line; lung - nothing abnormal; no vedema in lower limb;
knee jerk - strong; both right and left equal;
cremasteric reflex - left (++) right (+); perception normal; grip - left hand stronger than right; unable
to write with the right hand - left, normal.

## Diagnosis:

Paresis of the right half pert of body and there is fear of aphasia (thrombosis of the brain).

The complete list of the various dates on which I treated Baron HARADA appears on the attached sheet marked Exhibit A and is taken from my clinical diary.

From 1942 on Dr. SONEDA was the doctor in charge of Baron HARADA's case and Dr. MURIYAMA also treated Baron HARADA and each knew that the other was treating him.
