10-(1) Are there any prospects of attaining within the earliest possible period our minimum demands which were decided at the Imperial Conference on Sentember 6 by the continuation of negotiations with the United States?

There is no hope of attaining our demands within the earliest possible period.

Explanation

Judging from the past procesals and attitudes of the United States, on the one hand, there is suspicion that she is adopting a policy of prolonging negotiations under the name of adjusting diplomatic relations in order to avoid trouble between Japan and the United States until her military preparations are adjusted and completed, and on the other hand, the United States feel suspicious and uneasy as to the Empire's true motives, attitude, and whether or not the Empire would really carry out by peaceful means her intended foreign policy. She is strictly adhering to the so-called four principles, with the result that she is placing more emphasis on the question of the stationing and withdrawal of troops in China and French Indo-China contained in our definite proposals, and at the same time it can be recognized that she has no Intention of concluding the negotiations until she can obtain satisfactory promises from Japan in regard to these various points. Therefore, we have no alternative but to say that it is nearly impossible to have our proposal accepted within the earliest possible period.
